



Image Sculptor — User Addendum

This short addendum adds two points to the existing Image Sculptor guide. Everything else in the guide still applies.

Two ways to reset — and what each one keeps

Image Sculptor now has two different kinds of reset, and it is worth knowing which one you are using, because they treat your loaded files differently.

The first is the big RESET ALL button at the top. This is a clean slate: it sets every adjustment back to its default AND removes the files you have loaded into the tool — your texture overlay, your loaded looks, and your loaded LUTs. Use it when you want to start over completely.

The second kind is gentler and keeps your loaded files. When you click any of the one-tap preset buttons — Landscape, High-Contrast, Portrait, Animals, Birds — the tool sets the sliders to that preset's recipe but leaves your loaded texture, looks, and LUTs in place. The small RESET next to "Auto-Start Looks" behaves the same way: it returns the sliders to their defaults without throwing away anything you have loaded.

In short: RESET ALL clears everything including your loaded files; the preset buttons and the small RESET only change the sliders and keep your files. (In earlier versions the preset buttons used to remove loaded files as well — that no longer happens.)

Control	Resets sliders?	Keeps loaded files?
RESET ALL (top button)	Yes — all of them	No — clears texture, looks, and LUTs
Preset buttons (Landscape, etc.)	Sets them to the preset	Yes — files are kept
RESET (next to Auto-Start Looks)	Yes — tonal & vignette	Yes — files are kept

Note on saved sessions

Image Sculptor remembers your adjustment settings — sliders, curves, vignette, and which looks and LUTs were switched on — and restores them automatically when you come back. It does not re-open the actual image, texture, LUT, or CSV files you had loaded, because web browsers cannot reliably store large files this way.

So after you reload the page or return later, re-open the image, texture, LUT, or CSV files you were working with. Your settings will reapply to them. This is a deliberate part of the tool's offline, single-file design, not a fault.

Everything stays on your own device. Image Sculptor does not upload your images or files anywhere.
